ChatGPT. ChatGPT is an artificial intelligence chatbot developed by OpenAI and released in November 2022. The name 'ChatGPT' combines 'Chat', referring to its chatbot functionality, and 'GPT', which stands for Generative Pre-trained Transformer, a type of large language model. https://chat.openai.com/	
Grammarly. Grammarly is an American cloud-based typing assistant. It reviews spelling, grammar, punctuation, clarity, engagement, and delivery mistakes in English texts, detects plagiarism, and suggests replacements for the identified errors. It also allows users to customize their style, tone, and context-specific language. https://www.grammarly.com/	
D-ID. Groundbreaking AI technology brings portrait photos to life. D-ID turns photos into video in 30 seconds. https://www.d-id.com/photo-to-video/	
DALL·E 2. DALL·E 2 is an AI system that can create realistic images and art from a description in natural language. It's created by the same company, OpenAI, that created and runs ChatGPT. https://openai.com/product/dall-e-2	
Character.ai. Character.ai is a neural language model chatbot web application that can generate human-like text responses and participate in contextual conversation. The characters can be anything – the breakthrough AI technology can bring your ideas to life. Note though that <i>everything</i> the characters say is made up – don't trust everything they say or take them too seriously, they may even be mistakenly offensive! https://beta.character.ai/	

Write & Improve. Developed by the University of Cambridge, Write & Improve is a free tool that helps every learner to improve their English writing. Learners can choose from hundreds of tasks at all levels, or they can create their own tasks. They can then write their answers and submit to get a result linked to the CEFR as well as feedback on where their writing needs improvement. There is the option to resubmit after changes to check again. <https://writeandimprove.com/>



Road to Grammar. Road to Grammar is a site that offers quizzes, games and extra practice for all the key grammar points, as well as some key vocabulary topics. Each category comes with explanations and examples and when learners take the tests online they receive instant feedback and explanations. <http://www.roadtogrammar.com/>



Google Docs. Google Docs is an online word processor included as part of the free, web-based Google Docs Editors suite offered by Google. Users can create, and collaborate on online documents – they can be edited with secure sharing in real time and from any device. <https://www.google.co.uk/docs/about/>



ZeroGPT. ZeroGPT can detect OpenAI text – it is the most advanced and reliable ChatGPT, GPT4 & AI content detector and can check for plagiarism. Professional writers, students, educators, freelancers, copywriters have used ZeroGPT to detect text's source whether it derives from AI tools (like ChatGPT, Google Bard, ...) or human brain effectively. <https://www.zerogpt.com/>



Bing. Bing is an AI-powered copilot for the web created by Microsoft. Once you have downloaded the app, Bing helps you turn information into action, making it faster and easier to go from searching to doing. Ask questions. Chat to refine results. Midjourney. Midjourney is a generative artificial intelligence program which generates images from natural language descriptions, called 'prompts', similar to OpenAI's DALL-E 2 and Stable Diffusion. It claims to be exploring new mediums of thought and expanding the imaginative powers of the human species. The online community provides collaboration to create new worlds, fantastic characters and unique imagery from short text descriptions – and images far beyond the realm of stock library images. <https://www.midjourney.com>
